The Grace Sprouts program of Grace Church is an extension of the total ministry of our church. Our program is designed to develop the whole child, nourishing their spiritual, intellectual, emotional, physical and social growth in an atmosphere of Christian love.

Age Requirements

Any child between the ages of 18 months and 5 years of age (not in kindergarten) is eligible for enrollment.

Registration Fee

There is a non-refundable fee of \$25.00 for each child based on continuous enrollment per school year. Break in enrollment for any session will require a new registration fee.

Supply Fee

There is a non-refundable supply fee of \$55 due for each child per semester. This fee covers art and craft supplies, activities, snacks and Me Book. Should a child enroll mid-semester, the supply fee will be pro-rated.

Tuition

Tuition is due on the first school day of each month. A late fee of \$10.00 **per school day** will be applied if tuition is not received by the 3rd school day of the month.

\$85.00 a month per child attending 1 day a week.

\$150.00 a month per child attending 2 days a week.

\$30.00 a day for drop-ins.

(There will be a family discount of \$5.00 per sibling attending.)

Hours

The program operates on Monday and Wednesday each week. The hours are 9:00 am to 2:00 pm. <u>Children should not be dropped off before 8:50 am and should be picked up promptly at 2:00 pm.</u>

Parents who pick up their children after 2:05 p.m. will be assessed a late fee of \$1 per minute late. Remember to let your teacher know if someone other than you will be picking up your child. Driver's license photo ID of the designated person will be required.

Drop-Off Procedure

Beginning at 8:50 a.m. you may bring your child through the front doors of the church. Immediately in front of you is the sanctuary and that is our drop-off/pick-up room. You will bring your 3 or 4 year old child into the sanctuary and they will sit with their classmates in their designated row. The 18 month and 2 year old students will go to your immediate right in that room to meet before the teachers take them to the classrooms. We will have teachers supervising the rooms beginning at 8:50 a.m.-- but not before-- so please do not bring your child in earlier. At 9:05 a.m. the teachers will take their class back to their classrooms. This procedure will alleviate crowded hallways and classroom distractions from late arrivers. If you are late in arriving, you will need to bring your child to the Director's office and I will walk your child down to their classroom.

Pick-up Procedure

For pick-up, all the children will be in the designated meeting rooms again at 1:50 p.m. There will be two options for pick-up The first will be "carriders" (Sprouts-to-Go) where the parents will drive under the overhang, show a pick-up sign and the child will be brought out to your car. The second group will be "walkers" where the parents walk in to the church to pick up their child---this will be appropriate for the younger classes as sometimes we have late nappers in the Toddlers and Twos classes. *If* you have not picked up your child by 2:05 p.m. then you will be charged a late fee of \$1 per minute late.

Absences

Monthly tuition reserves a place for your child. **This fee will not be reduced for absences or holidays.** This is necessary as expenses of the program go on regardless of absences.

Health

A current copy of your child's immunization record must be on file with the school at the time of enrollment. While we encourage regular attendance, please do not expose other children to illnesses. Children should be free of fever for 24 hours without the use of medication. Any communicable illnesses such as strep throat, unexplained rash, croup, vomiting or diarrhea, pink eye, chicken pox, etc., are grounds for keeping your child at home. All such conditions should be reported to the director as soon as possible.

Should your child become ill, we will notify you to come pick them up. In the event of a life-threatening emergency we will call 911.

Holidays

Grace Sprouts follows the same schedule as the Keller Independent School District for holidays, breaks, and inclement weather. Please see the attached school calendar which lists the holidays and school breaks. A monthly Sprouts calendar is also given to parents to remind them of days off.

Field Trips

There are no field trips scheduled that require us to leave the campus. However, as as an extension of learning experiences and in the enhancement of our curriculum, we often have special events and visitors that come to our school. You will be notified in advance of the date and times. Parents are always welcomed to participate in these occasions. The supply fees and fundraisers usually cover the cost of these activities. (some examples in the past have been, petting zoo and pony rides, steam train, pediatric dentist and police officer, butterfly gardens, and bounce houses.)

Meals & Snacks

Children are served a snack based on each classroom's individual schedule. Sprouts provides goldfish, animal crackers, apple juice, and water to each classroom. If your child does not prefer these snacks, you may arrange with your child's

teacher to help provide special snacks for all classmates.

Students are required to bring their own lunch and a beverage for lunch. We have no means to microwave any meals.

DO NOT send milk in your child's sippy cup as it will spoil during the day.

Personal Belongings

All children's belongings, including lunch boxes, backpacks, diapers, sippy cups, and resting mats should be clearly labeled with their name. We have very limited space available for storing resting mats. Please do not send bulky sleeping bags/mats. If you need assistance finding mats, please come to the Grace Sprouts office.

Messages

Please notify us by note, in person, email, or text, if someone other than the parent(s) will be picking up your child or if they are to be picked up early. Everyone picking up a child will be required to show an ID badge or driver's license as proof of identification.

Discipline

Our philosophy encourages children to develop self-discipline and to respect themselves, others, and belongings. We provide an environment that feels secure through a regular routine and provide activities to channel positive energy. Should a child need extra guidance, the teachers will use positive language by helping, demonstrating, leading, distracting and re-directing. As a last resort the child will be asked to sit away from the group in the same room for a short "time-out" and then be asked to return to the group. If there is an ongoing need, the parent will meet with the teacher or director in order to help the child. Parents should inform teachers of special circumstances, which may contribute to the child's behavior. After repeated trials with the child with no improvement, a parent will be called to come and pick up the child from school. This is not a punishment but rather a means to maintain a learning and controlled environment.

Chapel

On Wednesdays, we have time set aside to sing songs and learn a Bible story. Learning and integrating lessons about Jesus is important to us and to our program.

Me Books

Throughout the school year, we take pictures, and save student projects and artwork. We construct a "Me Book" as a keepsake for parents. The cost of this book is included in your supply fee.

Volunteer Opportunities

Parent involvement is encouraged and recommended. We have opportunities for you to serve this program by reading to students, donating your time to special projects, donating gently used toys, books, and supplies (paper goods, snacks, craft stuff), substituting, making copies and helping teachers with crafts.

We run the Labels for Education program and the Box Tops program at Grace, them for submission.

Fundraisers

We have fundraisers throughout the year to allow us to meet the financial obligations of the school not covered by tuition and to improve the school facilities and equipment. We try to keep the fundraisers to a minimum. However, all families of students are expected to participate in all fundraisers.

Birthdays and Celebrations

If you wish to share your child's birthday with the class, we welcome you to do so by providing a special treat or snack for every classmate to honor your child. Because Grace Sprouts is a Christian program, we also celebrate holidays, which reflect our Christian belief. Each classroom is responsible for its own celebration. Please see your child's teacher for party information and sign-ups.

Curriculum

The entire staff is dedicated to providing a Christian learning environment for your preschooler at Grace Sprouts. We have a well-developed curriculum, which includes a variety of themes, academics, crafts, Bible lessons, Spanish and social activities to enhance your child's spiritual and academic growth. Christ is woven throughout the curriculum and is the center of all we do. Free play both outside on the playground and in the gym is incorporated into our daily schedules.

Co-Curricular Activities

Spanish: We offer this class on Mondays. This program allows your child to learn some basic Spanish. Our curriculum, Spanish Champs, is hands-on by incorporating, movement, music, crafts, puppets, and games.

Our Statement of Faith
